

The Aspen Institute was born in the Aspen Valley, Colorado, USA, in 1950, as a philanthropic institution called to bring together the country's leaders to reflect on the future from a humanist vision inspired by the timeless values of Western society. José Ortega y Gasset played a pivotal role and served on the Institute's Board of Trustees from its inception.

Today the Aspen Institute is recognised worldwide as one of the world's leading forums for public policy dialogue, civic values and leadership development. Its programmes and debates attract thousands of people from all sectors of society. Over time, twelve Aspen Institutes have been created in different parts of the world (Japan, India, Mexico, Italy, France, Germany, Spain, United Kingdom, Romania, Prague, Kiev, New Zealand, Kenya and Colombia) working together as a network with the shared mission of fostering enlightened leadership within each society.

Aspen Institute España began its activities in 2011. It is chaired by Javier Solana Madariaga and has the support of some of the country's leading companies on its Board of Trustees and in its membership program.

Every year it holds a dozen seminars on leadership and values in areas such as justice, education, the future of technology, politics and service to the common good, and has an extensive network of alumni and collaborating institutions.

It uses a specific discussion methodology, in which the ability to listen and exchange ideas in a Socratic dialogue based on classical and contemporary texts is encouraged.





#### THE ASPEN METHOD

Aspen Institute's activities are based on the Socratic method, not aimed at reaching conclusions or agreements, but rather at enhancing the quality of our questions and elevating the level of debate around today's most pressing challenges and the timeless questions of human values.

It is defined by the following key aspects:

- A careful environment that provides a calm reflection
- A very diverse group of participants, leaders of civil society, who have a plural and balanced dialogue
- The activities are carried out in small groups up to 25 people
- Moderators ensure a relaxed and humane atmosphere
- The Chatham House Rule\* encourages sincere and open dialogue
- A selection of readings to stimulate discussion and provide a common starting point
- Leadership and values are approached from a humanistic perspective



<sup>\*</sup>When a meeting is convened under the Chatham House Rule, participants have the right to use the information they receive, but neither the identity nor the affiliation of the speaker, nor that of any other participant, may be revealed.



Aspen Institute España offers three main activity formats: debate sessions, lectures and colloquiums, and seminars. Additionally, it designs customized programs for companies and organizations represented on its Board of Trustees.

#### DEBATE SESSIONS

These sessions bring together groups of 25-30 professional leaders to discuss issues such as geopolitics, economics, public policy, jurisprudence and technology with prominent speakers.

These sessions are held under the Chathman House Rule and last for two hours.

#### **SEMINARS**

The seminars provide a space for reflection over 2 to 4 days through a balanced and plural debate with a careful selection of participants, the prior reading of reference texts and the careful intervention of trained moderators who stimulate the conversation and preserve the dynamics of the seminars. The seminars are held under the Chathman House Rule.

#### LECTURES AND COLLOQUIUMS

Aspen invites leading speakers to participate in lectures and colloquiums designed to engage the public in meaningful dialogue. These events typically attract an audience of 100-150 participants and are usually broadcast live and recorded for our YouTube channel.

#### **CUSTOM PROGRAMS**

Aspen organises customed programs for members of the Board of Trustees upon request.


## ASPEN ESPAÑA EXECUTIVE SEMINAR

In 2011, Aspen Institute España held its first seminar. The Aspen España Executive Seminar, also called the 'classic Aspen seminar', brought together 22 participants for the first time in the library of the Real Maestranza de Ronda (Málaga) and focused on transatlantic values and the challenges of contemporary leadership.

Currently, Aspen Institute España holds more than 50 activities per year, including programs, seminars, debates, lectures and customed programs. All of these activities are structured around the Aspen methodology, which brings together a diverse group of participants and includes a moderator. The discussions are guided by selected readings and conducted under the Chatham House Rule.

Over time, the programs, seminars, debates, and lectures have focused on five key thematic areas, with 'Leadership and Values' as the primary emphasis. The other topics include 'Future of Democracy,' 'Technology and Society,' 'Economy and Society,' and 'Sustainability,' which encompass various topics such as geopolitics, justice, education, and health.

## **OUR IMPACT**

Aspen Institute España has earned a reputation for bringing together thought leaders, creatives, academics, and diverse, non-partisan members of the public to address some of the world's most complex problems.

The goal of these meetings is to have an impact beyond the conference room. They are designed to provoke, promote, and enhance actions and initiatives in the real world. Aspen Institute España organizes non-partisan initiatives that drive dialogue and action on current challenges through year-long programs where leaders explore their core values to drive action in their communities and

businesses. Aspen Institute España also organizes lectures and colloquiums that offer the public opportunities to engage with experts and with each other.

#### Leadership & Values Program

This program unites the leadership and values seminars that Aspen Institute España has conducted for over a decade, serving as the foundation for our other offerings: the Aspen España Seminar, the Aspen Leadership and Values Seminar, and the Aspen Youth Seminar. These seminars involve reading classical texts from philosophy, politics, and Western literature to explore the fundamental values of an open society and the challenges in defining what that society entails.

#### Tech & Society Program

After its seventh edition, it has become a key space in Spain for addressing the major issues posed by technological advancements. The program, co-organized with Fundación Telefónica, annually gathers 30 professionals for four debate sessions featuring prominent technology speakers. Each edition of the Program includes a Socrates Seminar usually held at La Granja de San Ildefonso (Segovia) or in Ronda (Málaga).

#### Global Politics Program

The Global Politics Program, whose first edition took place in 2012, annually gathers a prominent group of young leaders — up to 40 years old — from Spain's main political parties. Its goal is to provide a forum for debate with individuals who have a vocation for politics and public service, and who have demonstrated leadership potential. This initiative consists of a seminar and four sessions throughout the year, in the form of debates with guest speakers, to discuss critical issues in the context of politics and public service.

#### Sustainability Program

The Seminar starts from the urgent debate on climate change and the energy transition to arrive at the question of what social, economic, and political changes are necessary to create a more just and sustainable society. The goal is to create a reflective space that allows for long-term thinking and debate about the world we will leave for future generations. The Seminar is held annually in the city of Málaga.
